Now that Spring is finally here, it's time to get out and savor Rappahannock's many opportunities to enjoy the arts and community.







Mike Mahoney directs a production of the Tom Stoppard play The New York Times called Stoppard's "richest, most ravishing comedy to date, a play of wit, intellect, language, brio and ... emotion." The cast includes well-known local actors Andy Platt, Lakota Coon, Stephanie Mastri, Sam Clifton, Petrina Huston, and others.

"Arcadia" is considered by some critics as Stoppard's best work and also one of, if not the, best plays of the latter half of the 20th Century. It premiered in London in 1993 and won the Olivier Award for best new play. Its New York City premier gained it the New York Drama Critics' Circle Award for best play.

The play moves back and forth between the early 1800s and the present at the elegant estate owned by the Coverly family. It explores the relationship between past and present, order and disorder, certainty and uncertainty, intellect and romance, truth and time, tempered by the disruptive influence of sex.


