
RAAC's big news this month is the announcement of our 2017 Claudia Mitchell Arts Fund grants -17 awards to Rappahannock artists and organizations, totaling \$43,500! It was a very competitive process again this year with many excellent proposals. See below for a list of this year's grantees and a description of their funded projects.

Over the past five years, RAAC has given away almost \$160,000 to 46 different artists and organizations in the community through our Claudia Mitchell Arts Fund. These artists and organizations align with RAAC's goal of inspiring art and building community in Rappahannock. Net proceeds from our programs and events, combined with contributions from our generous donors, make this support possible - thank you!

RAAC takes a summer recess to recharge, plan, and prepare for our fall programs. There will be no First Friday at the Movies or Second Friday at the Library talks until September. 2017 Claudia Mitchell Arts Fund grants total \$43,500

The 17 grants range in amount from \$500 to \$5,000 and include a diversity of educational and performance projects, a variety of media, emerging and established artists, artistic and institutional development, arts programs within community-based organizations, and collaborative projects.

 a 3-day workshop for local writers at Bookworks Studio in Flint

- Child Care & Learning Center (CCLC) for multi-arts programming including visiting artist residencies (David Costello, Joe Pipick); theater camp instructor; music curriculum & teacher training; "sound wall" for musical exploration
- Goodlife Theater for creating a new educational puppet production, tentatively titled "The Six Step Shuffle, Building Solutions to Problems" to be performed in cooperation with CCLC & Rappahannock Elementary School
- Barbara Heile for teaching twice-monthly "spontaneous painting" classes to seniors at the Rappahannock Senior Center from July 2017 to June 2018
- Kid Pan Alley for 3-day songwriting & singing workshops for adults and high school students, plus a community performance featuring Reisler, Ysaye Barnwell & Three Good Reasons in spring 2018
- Sheila Lamb for a 2-week writer's residency at the Porches Writing Retreat in Nelson County, VA to finish her novel begun in 2015
- Mountainside Dance Center for scholarships for young dancers plus a June showcase by visiting children's dance company, Hope Garden Ballet Academy
- Rappahannock High School Band Boosters for scholarships for individual instrumental music instruction, plus master classes by instructors
- Wil Sands for a photojournalism project exploring the historical, cultural & economic dynamics of life in rural America, focused on Rappahannock County. Culminates in a public exhibit & forum at Aileen Factory and publication in journalism outlets
- Wendi Sirat for a series of 3 community drum circles at the RAAC Theater in fall 2017
- Stone Hill Theatrical Foundation for support of citizen theater and theatrical productions in Rappahannock County

CCLC & RAAC Community Theatre summer workshops

Coming off a highly successful run of Tom Stoppard's critically acclaimed play "Arcadia," the RAAC Community Theatre is now launching a new initiative with Rappahannock's Child Care and Learning Center (CCLC).

In June and July, the Theatre will conduct workshops for youngsters attending several of CCLC's summer camps. The workshops will teach the basic elements of acting as well introduce campers to production components such as make-up, costumes, and stage blocking.

The workshops will be taught by Lucia Hanover, whose experience includes acting, directing, and producing plays in New York City, including the Herbert Berghof Studios. Lucia will focus on having the children participate in games and exercises exploring different characters from plays like Peter Pan, as well as learn improvisational techniques.

"Sponsoring an acting summer camp for kids is something we've talked about for a couple of years, and I am delighted this summer it is going to become a reality," said Patty Hardee, RAAC Community Theatre artistic director. "We are so fortunate to have someone of Lucia's caliber to conduct these workshops. The kids are going to love it, and hopefully the camp workshops will develop a talent pool where these youngsters can participate in future RAAC productions."


