**Sunday Virtual House Concert at 7pm (July 26)** — *Because We Have Music*— will feature Lea Morris, Evan Espinola with Lorraine Duisit, and Kid Pan Alley hosts Paul Reisler with Cheryl Toth. The concert celebrates the release of Kid Pan Alley's new single, *On Our Way to Liberty* as well as the reopening of the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts. Lea Morris is a singer and songwriter whose "soul-folk" blends gospel, jazz, country and R&B with authentic, thought provoking song craft. She recently won the Grand Prize in the prestigious Bernard Ebb songwriting contest. She is currently working on her 9th full-length album. Rappahannock's Evan Espinola is a gifted songwriter, singer, and instrumentalist. He'll be joined by his mother, Lorraine Duisit, who played with Trapezoid throughout the 1980s.
