**Sunday Virtual House Concert continues this Sunday at 7pm (Sep 13)** — *Because We Have Music* — will feature Howard Levy, Mai Bloomfield, and Kid Pan Alley hosts Paul Reisler and Cheryl Toth. The list of credits from these performers would fill a book—from Dolly Parton, the Flecktones, and Jason Mraz to Paul Simon, Leonard Cohen, and John Prine. Don't miss this very special concert to celebrate the power of music and community.

Levy is acknowledged as the world's most advanced diatonic harmonica player, and was a founding member of the Bela Fleck and the Flecktones as well as Trio Globo. Mai Bloomfield is a singer-songwriter-cellist-guitarist and composer. As a solo artist, she has received

songwriting awards from the Kerrville, Telluride, and Rocky Mountain Folks Festivals.
